

A MESSAGE FROM FATHER BRADY



This summer marks the completion of my seventh year serving you as pastor of St. Pius X Church, and despite the recent challenges we've faced, particularly the health challenges of our clergy, my assignment here continues to be a wonderful blessing. As a community, we've had a good year on all levels, and I want to thank you for your support of me and all of our clergy.

St. Pius continues to be a dynamic and vibrant parish. With the completion of the Ministry Building last year, we now have the facilities necessary to support our ministries. St. Pius continues to grow in attendance, new registrations, ministerial activity, and participation in the sacraments. This growth is only possible because of your high level of commitment to parish life prompted by God's Grace.

We continue to be financially stable, and continue to pay ahead on the debt associated with the church building. As of June 30, 2025, we have prepaid \$1.2 million of the principle, and the

total principle amount is now less than \$10 million (the peak was \$11.8 million). Assuming we continue this trajectory, the church building will be paid off in approximately 13.5 years. Seven years ago, the projection was more than 30 years. This success is because of your generosity, and I want to thank you for that. However, most importantly we continue to thrive spiritually. Mass attendance has increased, as have the number of Confessions, and service within and outside our community has increased. These things indicate the many generous hearts among us, and the willingness to share our time, talent and treasure.

For this coming year, however, the big news is the start of construction of the new school building and library for our elementary school! For those of you who were here 10 years ago, you might remember the survey to identify the needs of the parish, and that survey led to the construction of the new church. At the same time, many of you also identified the need for a new school building. Now, some 25 years after SPES officially opened, we are ready to complete the campus master plan with the launch of the capital campaign to fund the new buildings, "Fulfilling the Legacy."

The master plan adopted when SPES was built called for the removal of the original mission church building, office and rectory, which were built in the 1960's, and to replace them with proper educational facilities. The new buildings are sorely needed as the old buildings have gradually become inadequate to meet the educational needs of our children and will not meet school accreditation standards in the near future. The new building will also ensure that modern safety codes are met. Needless to say, I am very excited about this project!

Admittedly, the task is tall, as the project cost is \$15 million dollars. However, thanks to the good stewardship of Mrs. DesOrmeaux, our current principal, and for the 20 years prior to her, Ms. Lemaire, SPES has no current debt, is financially sound, and has a positive cash flow. When asked, please prayerfully consider your response to help "fulfill the legacy" for St. Pius Elementary School.

I invite you to review this year's annual report, which provides information on the project as well as other information regarding our parish community. Thank you again for making my job as your pastor a joy, and for continuing to teach me through your faith. Your support of our community is very much appreciated. May God continue to give success to the work of our hands, and may He bless us with continued growth to love as Jesus does!



before Mass



Patricia Colbert-Cormier not only dedicated her time to St. Pius X, but was also an award-winning teacher and civil rights activist.

Each morning before St. Pius X's 6 a.m. and 7:30 a.m. Daily Masses and Saturdays before the 5 p.m. Mass, Mass goers gather to recite the Rosary and other prayers specific to the liturgical seasons. Over the last seven years, St. Pius X has seen an increase in those attending Daily Mass requiring an additional Mass to be added at 12:05 p.m. and Masses every Saturday morning. Currently, an average of 300 parishioners and guests attend Mass each day during the week and an average of 2,800 during the weekend.

Currently leading the Saturday afternoon prayer recital is parishioner, Ms. Patricia Colbert-Cornier. Ms. Patricia Colbert-Cormier, a parishioner since 1970, went to school at Holy Family (formerly St. Paul Elementary), Immaculate Heart of Mary and Holy Rosary Institute before receiving her B.S., M.S. and Ed.S. from University of Southwestern Louisiana (now known as ULL). She is the mother of four children, Dr. Dolores Cormier-Zenon, National Board Certified teacher and mentor: Mr. John C. Cormier, entrepreneur and investment banker: Dr. Jason L. Cormier. neurosurgeon; and Jeremiah J. Cormier, deceased. Her children received many of their sacraments at the parish, most memorably being her youngest, Jeremiah J. Cormier. Jerry received all of his Sacraments of Initiation here at St. Pius X, then heartbreakingly his funeral rites were conducted here in 1996.

Despite such a major loss, Colbert-Cormier's great faith allowed her to continue her service as a high school teacher where she was recognized in 1996 as an honoree of the American Teacher Awards sponsored by the Walt Disney Co. and McDonald's Corporation, as well as an award winner of the Tandy Technology Scholars program that recognizes teachers and students who have achieved excellence in the areas of science, computer science and mathematics. In 2003, she was the winner of the Lafayette Education Foundation's Teacher Award. A few of her other achievements include receiving an Albert Einstein Fellowship at NASA, serving as a finalist for the National Teachers Hall of Fame and several human and civil rights awards. Most recently, she received the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Award sponsored by the Diocese of Lafayette's Office of Black Catholic Ministries.

Somehow, even while raising four children, earning advanced degrees, receiving professional awards, and being a trailblazer in human and civil rights, Colbert-Cormier still found time to give back to her faith community. In the early 1980's before St. Pius X employed professional organists, she was a volunteer organist for the parish and also served as a choir member. Additionally, she taught religion classes and served as a member and Treasurer of the Parish Pastoral Council, as well as a lector, Extraordinary Eucharistic Minister, assistant to the Sacristan, Sacristan and a member of several ministries.



From the Words of Pope John Paul, II

"Your commitment to the altar is not only a duty, it is an honor, a genuine holy service...The altar server occupies a privileged place in the liturgical celebration. Those who serve at the altar assist Jesus Himself in the Eucharist."

In a 2024 address to Altar Servers at the Vatican's St. Peter's Square, Pope Francis acknowledged Altar Servers as being servants of Jesus' love and wounded heart that heal our wounds, save us from death and give us eternal life.

St. Pius X's Altar Servers are usually registered parishioners in 4th - 12th grades, who have been baptized in the Catholic Church, received their First Holy Communion, and feel called to serve God. These young men and women play a vital part in ensuring Mass goes smoothly. Altar Servers carry the cross or processional candles; hold the Bible for the priest:

carry the incense and censer; present the bread, wine, and water to the priest during the preparation of the gifts; assist him when he receives the gifts; wash the priest's hands; and assist the deacons.

In addition to growing in respect and understanding of the Mass, serving as an Altar Server allows one to give back to their faith community by serving others. It's also a wonderful community in which to belong. Altar Servers make friends and learn to lead by example as they shadow a more experienced Altar Server or mentor someone new.

DID YOU KNOW?

73% of seminarians in the Class of 2025 were altar servers.

Above all, our Altar Servers role in celebrating the eucharistic liturgy contributes to the knowledge we receive from the Word, our nourishment from the Eucharist, and the praise and glory we are able to give God each week. None of these would be possible without the help of some of God's most faithful servants, the St. Pius X Altar Servers.

MINISTRY SIC

Since the Old Covenant, music and singing have allowed us to celebrate the liturgy and exemplify our passion and love for Christ. This is most eloquently described in Ephesians 5:19, "Addressing one another [in] psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing and playing to the Lord in your hearts." The Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC) describes liturgical music as "a treasure of inestimable value, greater even than that of any other art."

St. Pius X's Music Ministry has been an invaluable treasure since the 1960's before the parish was canonically formed. Some of the founding ministers include: Leo Cavell (male's choir), Ethel Savoy (girl's choir), Bob Lacour (funeral choir and choir for all ages), Dick Goula (adult choir), Annick Colbert (handbell & children's choir). Les Waguespack (youth choir), Karen Melancon (children's handbell choir). Other music ministers throughout parish history include: Therese Comeaux, Doris Bienvenue, Michael Goudeau, Paul Sahuc, and Karen Melancon. Some of the cantors that served were Margaret Montz, Hope Prejean, Linda Nodd, Karen Melancon and Amanda Gamble (youth).

St. Pius X's current music minister, Karen Begnaud Melancon, has a tenure that began shortly after the parish formed in 1968. As a life-long member of St. Pius X, her first performance was at one of the parish's sacramental rites when she was in the 1st grade. Too little to see above the podium, she had to stand on a crate just to reach the microphone. What followed would be nearly 50 years of faithful service in St. Pius X's Music Ministry, which more formally

began when she served as a volunteer cantor in the 7th grade. She sang in the folk and adult choirs through her high school and college years. By 1988, Karen was offered the music minister position where she continues to direct the adult and children's choir, and has led efforts to perform at funerals, nursing homes and concerts. Karen is married to Tim Melancon and is the mother of Colleen, Kyle, Kevin and Anna-Claire. Karen and Tim's parents have been parishioners since St. Pius X's earliest days. With the birth of their fifth grandchild in June 2025, Karen and Tim's family continues their legacy of growing in faith and service to the parish for over four generations.

With the help of Geraldine Hubbell, parishioner and professional accompanist, St. Pius X purchased its first organ in 1972. During that time, the parish relied on several dedicated volunteers: Shirley Alexander, Betty Bares, Therese Comeaux, Pat Cormier, Patty Darbonne, Lorita Dauphin, Lynn Frederick, Geraldine Hubbell, Sylvia Pilcher, Ethel Savoy, and Gary Scallon. In 1982, St. Pius X employed its first professional organist, Steve Branch. Following Branch was Arleen Soileau who played at the 5 p.m. Mass, then Herndon Spillman, professor of organ at LSU, in 1985. Since 1990, St. Pius X's organist has been Kevin Martin.

Contemporary music can be traced back to the mid 1970's after a contemporary music concert directed by Les Waguespack led to the formation of a folk choir under the direction of Margaret Kresse and Steve Spedale. Members included Karen Begnaud Melancon, Hope Higginbotham, Steve Spedale, Carol Guidry, and Dave Landgrave. Guitarists during that time and into the 21st century included Phil Bordelon, Rusty Chastant, Tom Spedale, and Margo Uter. Under the leadership of Fr. Steve LeBlanc, Michael Hogan was hired to form the Life Teen Band.

Today, St. Pius X's contemporary musical performances are led by Glenn DeLaune. For Glenn, using his God given talent to glorify our Lord is the most rewarding part of his job. Before leading this ministry at St. Pius X, he served as the choir director for St. Anne Catholic Church in Youngsville for over 25 years. James & Kristyn Opdenhoff also contribute to parishioner's worship experiences as well.

St. Pius X Receives the Archbishop Thomas Murphy Parish Stewardship Award from International Catholic Stewardship Council

St. Pius X Catholic Church was the 2024 recipient of the Archbishop Thomas Murphy Parish Stewardship Award presented by the board of directors of the International Catholic Stewardship Council (ICSC). ICSC is an affiliate of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops that supports and promotes the teaching of Christian stewardship and responsible philanthropy in the

Catholic Church. The Archbishop
Murphy Parish Stewardship Award,
the highest achievement award a
parish can receive, is presented
annually to a parish which exemplifies
a long-term commitment to a
stewardship way of life. Award
recipients exhibit an ongoing
conversion to stewardship as
evidenced by an engaged parishioner
base, growth in spirituality and its
witness and outreach to the larger
community.

Thanks to the ingenuity and selfless dedication of the people of St. Pius X Church, the parish has come such a long way since it began as a mission church in a metal warehouse with a makeshift altar and folding chairs. Today, their gifts of time, talent and treasure continue to grow despite the pandemic, inflation and an economic slowdown. As a result, the parish's 3,959 families and 11,981 individuals continue to enjoy their new Church that seats 972 people. Capital expansion, such as the renovation of the old Church into a ministry building, also exhibits the great faith of the

people of St. Pius X. However, the congregation's prayers and service were also unparalleled in this international competition. The additional Masses that were added to the Daily Mass schedule in order to better serve its 2,800 Sunday congregants and 300 daily Mass goers (on average) are examples, along with an increase in Confession times and available Confessors. A perpetual adoration chapel and other opportunities to worship and serve have played a part in St. Pius X's stewardship accolades as well.

St. Pius X service groups, such as the Women's Guild and Knights of Columbus, have grown in membership and the services they provide. Retreats continue to thrive providing a renewed and strengthened spirit to retreatants who then give back by supporting and serving the parish community. Many formation groups bring people closer to Christ through prayer, study, and faith sharing.

MARRIAGE PREPARATION

In 2013, Jill and John Deats began mentoring an engaged couple from another parish. Inspired by this experience, the Deats proposed a similar program to Fr. Brady who enthusiastically supported it. Thus, St. Pius X's In-Home Marriage Preparation Ministry began in 2024 with 20 couples volunteering to mentor other couples. Since its inception, the ministry has offered a unique and impactful way to support engaged couples while also enriching the marriages of the couples who volunteer to mentor.

Offering a deeper dive into Catholic marriage than traditional formats, the program offers a personal approach to ministry that fosters a profound understanding of married life. Engaged couples who participate consistently express gratitude for the program, reporting a much deeper understanding of the Sacrament and the commitment they are making.

The program, designed by Jan and Lloyd Tate who have been married for over 50 years, offers six in-home sessions held every two to three weeks for approximately two hours. Mentor couples share their experiences and guide engaged couples in meaningful discussions about: The Sacrament of Marriage and the Marital Covenant; Communication; Finances; Conflict Resolution; and Moral Decision-Making.

The benefits of being a mentor couple include: Meaningfully contribute to your faith by strengthening the Sacrament of Marriage; Witness engaged couples gain a deeper understanding and appreciation for Catholic marriage; Experience personal growth and renewed appreciation for your own marriage through reflection and discussion; and Form rewarding relationships with the couples you mentor.



One of the most rewarding aspects is the relationships formed with the engaged couples through deep sharing and conversation. It's truly inspiring to see their understanding of marriage deepen beyond their initial expectations. This ministry also revitalizes our own understanding and appreciation of the Sacrament of Marriage.

MISSION CLUB UPDATE

The Mission Club's Food Pantry and efforts to help the homeless allow St. Pius X to provide residents, within the geographical boundaries of the parish, with year-round access to food if they're hungry, drink if they're thirsty and even warm clothing accessories if they're cold.

These efforts also allow St. Pius X to relieve the stress and burden of families having to make a trade-off

between buying food or paying the bills, receiving medical care or paying for other necessities.

The Mission Club also collaborates with Food Net to supplement the food that generous parishioners are already providing, provide them food when needed, as well as deliver food to their homebound clients both in and outside of the parish's geographical area.

A WITNESS OF PRAYER, CARRYING ONE'S CROSS & EVANGELIZATION

AIMIA "MIMI" DOUCET



Aimia "Mimi" Doucet, born Catholic in Opelousas and raised in Lewisburg, LA, attended Our Mother of Peace Catholic School in Church Point. She credits her second-grade teacher, Sister Maureen, for providing her first experience where she really felt the Holy Spirit, and leading her to a lifelong devotion to Mary.

As a residential mortgage lender specializing in new construction she shares her faith with others by giving her clients a cross that is blessed and prayed over by her team. To extend the blessings to all who enter her clients' new homes, Mimi suggests that they bury the cross in the foundation near the home's entrance. In her personal life, after reading that the Lord built the earth on the seas and rivers (Psalm 24:1-2), her faith also led her to get certified in scuba diving. Mimi notes, "Scuba diving gives me peace like no other, and I really feel like heaven will be as beautiful as the depths of the ocean."

Like many of us, there was a period in Mimi's life when she didn't feel she was faithful to her church and wasn't giving her children the foundation of faith they needed. "They received their sacraments, but I was not faithful to daily prayer or Sunday Mass," she recalls. However, after her oldest son suffered with addiction, a failing marriage, and losing her grandmother and mother-in-law to cancer, she returned back to faithful prayer and rekindled her relationship with the Lord. Even during those times, I felt like I was only praying because I needed something. I still didn't understand what a true relationship with God really meant." After many years of struggling and living with guilt for not trusting in the Lord, a friend walked her through Jesus dying on the cross for her. "This is when I decided to really give my life to the Lord and attended a silent retreat at St. Abbey's in Covington. It was at that

retreat where I experienced the most powerful confession of my life and finally learned to forgive - not only others, but most importantly, myself." She continued her journey with attendance at an ACTS retreat, followed by a Cursillo retreat in 2021.

After moving to Lafayette in 2019, she attended many churches around the city seeking a faith community to call her own. "I joined St. Pius because St. Pius made me feel at home." Since becoming a parishioner, Mimi has enjoyed teaching preparation classes for First Communion, serving on the core team of Magnify Women's Ministry, and surrounding herself with women who have passion and love for the Lord. One of her most memorable experiences was adoring the presence of Jesus in the Eucharist at St. Pius X's perpetual adoration chapel. "I've always prayed to the Lord, but it wasn't until I began adoration that I started listening to Him. Listening is quite difficult for someone who is visionary and very goal-driven, yet the Lord has spoken to me many times there, which has taught me patience." Though many pastors have impacted her life and provided comfort in times of need, she'll never forget Fr. Brady's homily which spoke to her heart. During a noon Mass, Fr. Brady said, "We all have crooked lines in our life. God will straighten them. His will WILL be done."


To discern God's will for her, Mimi states, "I prayed many novenas asking God that if it was His will for me to have a relationship, to please send me a man with the same qualities of St. Joseph. And my prayers were answered." Kelly Mire and Mimi will marry in August 2025. "If there is one thing I've learned throughout my journey, it's that God loves me. When I accepted God's love, it allowed me to love fearlessly," Mimi concludes.

KNIGHTS RESTORE THE SOUNDS OF HEAVEN

Our parish patriarchs, Knights of Columbus Council #8901, continue to live up to their call to live with purpose and meaning and not just for themselves, but for all of us who belong to or visit the parish. Since 1976 an old plantation bell (donated by Murray "Tim" Boudreaux and installed by Ray Al Guidry), and a carillon (donated by Stella Roman of New Orleans), joyously rang throughout the day serving as another tangible symbol of our faith. However, in 2021, there may have been an uncomfortable silence to some after the parish had to remove the old bells to complete the parking lot project. That is, until this fiscal year, when the Knights donated the funds to purchase the equipment and installation. Restoring these sounds which are reflective of heaven also bring more cheer and life to our already vibrant campus.



MISSIONARIES LIVE OUT THE EVANGELICAL MISSION OF ST. PIUS X CHURCH



"Go into the whole world and proclaim the gospel to every creature" (Mark 16:15) is the primary purpose of supporting parishioners on their mission trips. The main goals of mission trip participants are to share the Good News with people who may not know Him, provide a witness emulating Christ's love and compassion, and share their personal testimonies of all that God has done in their lives. Whether engaging in Christian service like rebuilding or repairing homes, Corporal Works of Mercy like bringing food to the homebound, or Spiritual Works of Mercy like bringing hope and peace to those suffering, missionaries live out Jesus' Great Commission spreading the message of the Gospel throughout the world.

Over the years, more than 150 parishioners have participated in missions on behalf of St. Pius X. One such family is Phillip and Lacy Brupbacher, and their eight children. Nearly ten years ago, Phillip, began to reflect on the fact that there are roughly 3 billion human beings in the world who do not know Jesus Christ, have yet to encounter His loving grace or hear the truths of the gospel of Jesus Christ. After discerning whether he and his family were being called to serve Him in this way, God called them to Costa Rica. Leaving the comfort of their home and safety of America, they then embarked on their mission which has led to many trials and blessings that have shaped their family into who they are today.

This past fiscal year, the generosity of St. Pius X's parishioners helped to provide nearly \$40K to operate three mission centers in Nepal, and purchase land to build a small Catholic Church and mission center in a mountain village in the foothills of the Himalayans. Other efforts include preaching the Gospel to those who have never heard it, sharing the love of Jesus Christ to the lost and brokenhearted, training and discipling Catholic believers, and serving the poor by offering them meaningful employment opportunities.

It began with a small preschool and a large vision. Over 25 years ago, the St. Pius X community came together under the theme "A New School, A New Millennium" and built the exceptional school we proudly call St. Pius Elementary. Our visionaries laid the foundation, and now it is time to fulfill their legacy as we embark on the construction of the last phase. The new Innovative Learning Center is a 28,000-square-foot learning space that will serve as a hub for knowledge, faith, and collaboration for students.

The building will include three PreK3, four PreK4, and three Kindergarten classrooms equipped with private restrooms and sinks, ample storage, and dedicated space where children can enjoy quiet time for prayer. The new playgrounds have been designed to promote an environment that encourages hands-on learning and exploration. The playground will also include learning and reflection gardens.

The state-of-the art STREAM (Science, Technology, Religion, Engineering, Arts, Math) Lab will allow our older students to apply theoretical concepts to practical projects, connecting theory and application.



Our new library will merge modern technology with traditional resources. Younger students can explore books and interactive material, while older students can integrate technology into research and projects. The larger space will serve as a beautiful venue for hosting school events.

In addition to the STREAM Lab, our electives wing will include a new art room that will allow students to create with traditional mediums such as drawing and painting, as well as new mediums such as pottery and ceramics with our new art kiln. Our expanded Green Room will serve as a space where students can create engaging broadcast and digital content for SPNN (St. Pius News Network) and other school communications.

The new building will also feature designated speech, academic support, occupational therapy, and physical therapy areas, as well as collaborative spaces located at the ends of hallways that will offer small-group creative opportunities. Collectively, this new expansion will serve as a space for faith, knowledge, and growth for students for years to come.

FAITH | SERVICE



The mission of St. Pius comes to life through daily faith formation activities that nurture the spiritual growth of our students, faculty, and staff. Beginning in PreK, students are introduced to the love of God through Bible stories, prayers of our faith and Catholic liturgical seasons and traditions. As our religious education progresses through elementary and middle school, students are encouraged to become active participants in the Catholic faith. Weekly mass and monthly adoration allow our students to deepen their relationship with God. As students grow, they are offered opportunities to be witnesses of their faith, not just being learners in the classroom, but by embracing the mission of being disciples of Christ.




